Activities:

Field Trip To Arunhun Community - meeting point of fresh and salt water. Members treated themselves to a day trip in March to Arunhun Community in Warri North Local Government Area of Delta State. 60 kilometres away from Warri, Arunhun is the meeting point of the fresh water River Eithope, which has its source at Umuaja - Omutu and the salt water, Benin River empties into the Atlantic ocean at Ogheye. The twin communities of Arunhun and Abigborodo are renowned for wood logging, periwinkle trading, and native salt (potash production)

In the year under review, the Branch Secretary and NFS Desk Officer at Falcorp Mangrove Park, Esther Nwani, conducted 10 guided tours at the Park. Visitors who are mainly secondary and tertiary students were introduced to the Nigerian Field Society, the 17 Sustainable Development Goals, environmental conservation practices, Warri Kingdom history, and the biodiversity features of the Park. The branch, in collaboration with Coastal and Areas Development Initiative (CMADI), also conducted a long vacation reading and painting competition for host communities, primary school pupils, and secondary students.

These activities are meant to assist the branch' aim of setting up Environment Conservation Clubs in the schools within the locality.
